Each year, the Order of Constantine recognizes a group of Sigma Chi brothers for their commitment, dedication, and service to the Fraternity.

Induction into the Order of Constantine is considered to be the highest honor that the Sigma Chi Fraternity bestows upon one of its members.

Of the more than 365,000 brothers who have been initiated into the Sigma Chi, the honor of being named an Order of Constantine Sig has been conferred upon just 862 brothers since the Order's inception in 1948 at the 47th Grand Chapter, held in Seattle. At the Alpha Chi Chapter, we are proud to recognize that four of our brothers, more than double the international average per chapter, have earned this distinction.

As I write this report, the calendar is telling me that we are well into the Fall Semester and the Penn State Football Season. June and July seem like distant memories. However, two of those summer days were spent at 400 East Prospect Ave, and they stand out from the relatively beige background.

The first was June 8th when I attended the AX Annual Golf Classic. I am not a golfer, never have been, but I do enjoy that event which brings together our greatest number of alums. lt is like Homecoming used to be from the standpoint of attendance, only better. It is also an opportunity for me and more than 100 other Alumni to see just how good the house can look. Doug Sampsel, our on-site Property Manager, and his helpers did a fabulous job of picking up the pieces after our undergraduate brothers departed for Summer break. They made the place more than just presentable for that event. He and I did spend some time in the boiler room that day and confirmed some piping and electrical conditions which are part of our research to determine the feasibility of installing the air conditioning capabilities that were envisioned when the major renovation was undertaken nearly 20 years ago. I am sure it was tabled at the time due to cost considerations, and it obviously has not gotten any less expensive, but I believe it is still worthy of consideration for student comfort in the early Fall and late Spring,

competitiveness with downtown apartment living and other fraternities, and the possibility of renting some rooms in the Summer.

The second memorable date on my summer calendar was July 20th. That was the part of our Summer Work Weekend. **Jim Lundy, Dan Schlagel**, Doug and I got to spend some time working on the exterior of the building with about 15 Actives who showed up to help. Doug used a rented high-lift to take some brave souls up to the second and third floor levels to apply a fresh coat of paint. I had a second group down on the ground installing conduit for the new sound system for the yard. The new speakers will be mounted at ear height to maximize the effect, but at a lower overall volume to stay within the Borough noise ordinance. The yard is not only a sought-after venue for social events, but every activity that takes place out there is one less that occurs inside, where the finishes are more difficult to preserve.

All in all, a great summer, even though as usual, it flew by!



Letter from the Alumni President

In a timeframe when all of the rage on social media is about 'Bama rush and the massive investments that SEC schools are making in their fraternity

and sorority houses, Alpha Chi is not standing still. For the sixth year in a row, the Alpha Chi House Corporation won a Peterson gold award for most outstanding housing operations. That puts us in the top ten in the country.

Thanks to a significant amount of hard work to run our budget and collect all the money, we've been able to make significant improvements to the chapter house this year. This includes paving our parking lot (aka the tennis court), adding basketball hoops, and installing room-based air conditioning and new furniture.

Part of the need to constantly improve our house is twofold. First, it is 95 years old, and second, we have strong competition from new apartments downtown. I can now confidently say that we offer very competitive housing, and much better food and coffee. Our staff is doing a great job, and we are pleased to announce that we have a new House Director, Miss Cheryl Dixon, who moved in over the summer.

On top of that, as of August 1, our 4-year suspension with Penn State is over. That said, Sigma Chi, TKE, PIKE and Skull are all independent chapters, with TKE joining the independent ranks over the summer.

Your generous donations help us to stay ahead, and we now must embark on a fundraising to plan for the replacement of our 95-year-old slate roof. We will be looking for Alumni to help plan for this fundraising endeavor.

Several other pledge classes are close to reaching 100 percent participation in the Paving the Way campaign. You can participate in the Paving the Way for Alpha Chi campaign by purchasing a commemorative paver as follows:

- 8X4 paver for \$300 (\$25/mo)
- 8X8 paver for \$600 (\$50/mo)
- 12X12 paver and composite picture in the chapter house for \$1,000 (\$84/mo)
- Constantine Society-24X24 paver in distinctive color and composite picture for \$5,000
- Stuckeman Society-24X24 paver in distinctive color and composite picture for \$10,000 (tax-deductible for individual Brother when donated through the Sigma Chi Foundation)

Funds raised will be directed to the much-needed replacement of the tile roof, which wasn't addressed in the previous house improvements campaign.
